NOTES

<u>Double-crested Cormorant</u> One flying over the West boundary, then back over the river.

Trumpeter Swan One immature on the Lagoon.

Canada Goose Recent hazing practices showing results.

Red-tailed Hawk The Northwest Forest Pair in the Northwest Forest vicinity. No incubation. One adult of the SW Towers Pair at the SW corner area. One Adult from the 58 Place Pair flying to the south. No incubation. One immature flying from the grove East of the East mound.

<u>Killdeer</u> One flying over SW area to the South. Two were at the West meadow, where new forest is beginning. <u>Northern Shrike</u> One seen on the snag in the SW corner. Poor lighting and wet plumage prevented aging. Yellow-rumped Warbler Fifteen at the NE Forest.

Western Meadowlark Thirteen at the West Meadows.

Brewer's Blackbird Five were seen near the NE forest. Three were seen from the far SE foot bridge.
