<b>Appliances &amp; Scrap Metal</b>	Washers, dryers, dishwashers, ovens, stoves, water heaters, engines, microwaves, BBQs, lawn mowers, metal lawn chairs, swing sets, cast iron sinks and tubs, auto parts, iron, steel, aluminum (cans included), brass, copper & other ferrous and non-ferrous metals.	<b>NO</b> metals that are insulated, rubber coated, oily, previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials. <b>NO</b> light fixture ballasts. <b>NO</b> sealed drums.
<b>Refrigerators, Freezers &amp; Air Conditioners</b>	Refrigerators, freezers, and portable household air conditioners.	<b>NO</b> industrial fridges and freezers.
<b>Toilets &amp; Sinks</b>	Toilet seat, and wax ring on base must be removed.	
<b>Electronics</b>	DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, scanners, cell phones, CPUs and accessories like a keyboard or mouse.	<b>NO</b> computer monitors, laptop computers, TVs. Find free drop-off locations for computers, laptops & TV's at 1-800-RECYCLE or recyclewashington.org
<b>Cardboard</b>	Please flatten.	<b>NO</b> wax-coated cardboard.
<b>Batteries</b>	AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, D, 9v, rechargeable and cellphone batteries only.	<b>No</b> Ni-cads
<b>Lead Acid Batteries</b>	Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.	
<b>Propane Tanks</b>	Residential tanks only.	
<b>Bulky Yard Debris</b>	Logs and large branches greater than four inches in diameter. Place on tarp for easy removal.	<b>NO</b> brush, sod, grass clippings, blackberry bushes, leaves, small branches, rocks or stumps.
<b>Scrap Wood</b>	Clean wood and pallets. Place on tarp for easy removal. No need to remove nails.	<b>NO</b> painted, stained, treated or laminated wood or particle board.
<b>Reusable Household Goods</b>	Clean clothing (even the ripped and holey kind-it'll be made into rags, insulation, etc.) and miscellaneous household items in good condition.	<b>NO</b> wet items, <b>NO</b> furniture, <b>NO</b> broken or damaged items.
<b>Document Shredding</b>	Limit of 3 file-size boxes per vehicle - no exceptions.	
<b>Concrete, Asphalt, Rock, Brick &amp; Sand</b>	Place on tarp for easy removal. Rocks and smaller materials including sand must be in boxes or buckets. Remove plastic, metal and wood. Residential material only.	<b>NO</b> bags, just the sand inside.
<b>Mattresses</b>	Mattresses, box springs, and futons, any size.	<b>No</b> commercial loads. <b>No</b> wet/soiled items.

**NO flatbeds or dump trucks allowed. Vendors reserve the right to refuse oversized, commercial, contaminated, excessive or unacceptable loads.**

### DON'T BRING THESE HOUSEHOLD WASTES:

- **NO** tires
- **NO** construction/demolition debris
- **NO** motor oil, filters, antifreeze, or petroleum based products
- **NO** styrofoam
- **NO** plastics
- **NO** grass, leaves, or small yard debris
- **NO** garbage
- **NO** window glass/mirrors
- **NO** latex paint (see note below)
- **NO** plastic pools, toys, hoses, etc.
- **NO** painted/treated wood
- **NO** carpeting

Latex paint, if less than a quarter can-full, may be dried out by leaving the lid off, and placed in the garbage once dry. Share larger amounts with friends, donate to a local theater group, or dry by adding equal amounts of cat litter or paint hardener. Donate full cans to Habitat for Humanity: 206.292.5240.

### DON'T BRING THESE HAZARDOUS WASTES:

- **NO** paint of any kind
- **NO** solvents and thinners
- **NO** cleaning products
- **NO** pesticides/herbicides
- **NO** household chemicals
- **NO** fluorescent lights

Household hazardous waste can be disposed of at the Wastemobile in Auburn at The Outlet Collection (formerly known as the SuperMall) 10am-5pm, every Saturday and Sunday, near the loading docks and Sports Authority.
