Appliances & Scrap Metal	Washers, dryers, dishwashers, ovens, stoves, water heaters, engines, microwaves, BBQs, lawn mowers, metal lawn chairs, swing sets, cast iron sinks and tubs, auto parts, iron, steel, aluminum (cans included), brass, copper & other ferrous and nonferrous metals.	NO metals that are insulated, rubber coated, oily, previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials. NO light fixture ballasts. NO sealed drums.
Refrigerators, Freezers & Air Conditioners	Refrigerators, freezers, and portable household air conditioners.	NO industrial fridges and freezers.
Toilets & Sinks	Toilet seat, and wax ring on base must be removed.	
Electronics	DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, scanners, cell phones, CPUs and accessories like a keyboard or mouse.	<b>NO</b> computer monitors, laptop computers, TVs. Find free drop-off locations for computers, laptops & TV's at 1-800-RECYCLE or ecyclewashington.org
Cardboard	Please flatten.	NO wax-coated cardboard.
Batteries	AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, D, 9v, rechargeable and cellphone batteries only.	No Ni-cads
Lead Acid Batteries	Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.	
Propane Tanks	Residential tanks only.	
Bulky Yard Debris	Logs and large branches greater than four inches in diameter. Place on tarp for easy removal.	<b>NO</b> brush, sod, grass clippings, blackberry bushes, leaves, small branches, rocks or stumps.
Scrap Wood	Clean wood and pallets. Place on tarp for easy removal. No need to remove nails.	<b>NO</b> painted, stained, treated or laminated wood or particle board.
Reusable Household Goods	Clean clothing(even the ripped and holey kind-it'll be made into rags, insulation, etc.) and miscellaneous household items in good condition.	<b>NO</b> wet items, <b>NO</b> furniture, <b>NO</b> broken or damaged items.
Document Shredding	Limit of 3 file-size boxes per vehicle - no exceptions.	
Concrete, Asphalt, Rock, Brick & Sand	Place on tarp for easy removal. Rocks and smaller materials including sand must be in boxes or buckets. Remove plastic, metal and wood. Residential material only.	NO bags, just the sand inside.
Mattresses	Mattresses, box springs, and futons, any size.	No commercial loads. No wet/soiled items.

NO flatbeds or dump trucks allowed. Vendors reserve the right to refuse oversized, commercial, contaminated, excessive or unacceptable loads.

# **DON'T BRING THESE HOUSEHOLD WASTES:**

- NO tires
- NO construction/demolition debris
- NO motor oil, filters, antifreeze, or petroleum based products
- NO stvrofoam
- NO plastics
- **NO** grass, leaves, or small yard debris

- **NO** garbage
- NO window glass/mirrors
- NO latex paint (see note below)
- NO plastic pools, toys, hoses, etc.
- NO painted/treated wood
- NO carpeting

Latex paint, if less than a guarter can-full, may be dried out by leaving the lid off, and placed in the garbage once dry. Share larger amounts with friends, donate to a local theater group, or dry by adding equal amounts of cat litter or paint hardener. Donate full cans to Habitat for Humanity: 206.292.5240.

# **DON'T BRING THESE HAZARDOUS WASTES:**

- NO paint of any kind
- NO solvents and thinners • NO cleaning products
- NO pesticides/herbicides • NO household chemicals
- - **NO** fluorescent lights

Household hazardous waste can be disposed of at the Wastemobile in Auburn at The Outlet Collection (formerly known as the SuperMall) 10am-5pm, every Saturday and Sunday, near the loading docks and Sports Authority. For more
