# CITY OF KENT PARKS, RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES SECOND AMENDMENT (MINOR) to the 2015 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

#### A. BACKGROUND

- 1. The 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development provides a framework for implementing housing, human services and community development activities from 2020-2024.
- 2. Each year the City of Kent executes specific actions to implement the objectives and strategies of the five-year Consolidated Plan, which are outlined in the Annual Action Plan.
- 3. The City has \$126,628.26 in unspent FY 2015 funds that will expire in September of 2022.

## **B. Public Service Budget**

- 1. In 2015, the City allocated \$65,391 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to Multi-Service Center-Housing Stability Program to provide rent assistance grants to Kent residents; \$580.83 was unspent and recaptured
- The City allocated \$16,182 to Refugee Women's Alliance-Case
   Management and Emergency Assistance Project to provide
   linguistically/culturally appropriate case management and emergency
   assistance grants to immigrant and refugee clients residing in Kent; \$640
   was unspent and recaptured.
- The City also allocated \$11,182 to Refugee Women's Alliance-Senior Nutrition and Wellness Program to provide ethnically appropriate and nutritious congregate meals and health education for refugee and immigrant seniors residing in Kent; \$4,194.27 was unspent and recaptured.
- 4. The City plans to reallocate the cumulative total from these three public service projects (\$5,415.10) to the Kent Home Repair Program.

## C. Capital Project Budget

- 1. In 2015 the City allocated \$476,233 to the Home Repair Program.
- 2. In the First Amendment to the 2015 Annual Action Plan, the City reallocated \$129,766.60 from other Capital Projects to the Home Repair Program.
- 3. The Home Repair Program has a balance of \$64,728.98 that the City plans to use for the 2022 Home Repair Program. An amendment is not

required to utilize 2015 Home Repair Program budget for the 2022 Home Repair Program.

# D. Planning and Administration Budget

- 1. In 2015, the City allocated \$193,977 to the Planning and Administration (P&A) budget for personnel costs and planning and administration activities.
- 2. The P&A budget has a balance of \$56,484.28. The City plans to reallocate \$41,484.28 to the Home Repair Program.
- 3. The remaining \$15,000 in P&A will be utilized first for P&A in the 2022 program year. An amendment is not required to use 2015 P&A budget for 2022 P&A.

### **E. AMENDMENT**

1. Amend the 2015 Annual Action Plan to allow for the reallocation of \$5,415.10 of the public service budget and \$41,484.28 of the P&A budget to the Home Repair Program to ensure expenditure of funds before the expiration in September 2022.
